## Cardinal Vico Dies In Rome At Age Of 81 Years

Rome, Feb. 25.—(U.P.)—Antonio Cardinal Vico, 81, prefect of the Sacred congregation of rites, died today. Cardinal Vico ranked second in seniority among the cardinal bishops. Only five cardinals were older.

Cardinal Vico's death leaves several vacancies in the Sacred college, due to such recent deaths as that of Cardinal Tosi last month and Cardinal De Lai in October. The vacancies probably will be filled by a secret consistory soon. The last creations were at a secret consistory in December, 1927.

## Kansas Man Writes Story Of His Suicide For Topeka Newspaper

Topeka, Kan., Feb. 25.—(U.P.)—After writing the story of his suicide for a Topeka newspaper, Ralph R. Ferguson, 20, took his life at the home of the girl who had spurned his love.

When the staff of the Topeka Daily Capitol arrived at the office last night they found Ferguson's own story of the suicide in the mail. He had contributed several stories to the paper previously.

"It was suicide by poison," Ferguson's account read, and investigation confirmed it. "I told Dorothy I was 'going west' but she did not get the meaning."

Miss Dorothy Wadley, 19, said Ferguson once told her he was "going west and not to California." She denied having been in love with him. "The boy was quite sane," Ferguson wrote in his story, "but decided death and its mysteries were preferable to life sans love, sans friends and sans energy. He was not a coward and he met death as fool as a fountain."

He was found dying in front of the Wadley home.

## Lindy Refuses To Reveal Plans Of Date For Wedding

Cuernavaca, Mex., Feb. 25.—(U.P.)—Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh refused to reveal his wedding date or plans in an interview here today at the home of Ambassador Dwight Morrow but he indicated that he might "say something in a few days."

To every question he was asked, Col. Lindbergh answered: "Ask me that a little later."

Newspaper correspondents asked him: "Shall we interpret this as meaning you have made no plans yet?" "You can interpret this exactly as I say," Lindbergh answered.

## Station WGY Wins Fight Against Radio Commission

Washington, Feb. 25.—(U.P.)—The General Electric company, operating the gigantic broadcasting station WGY, Schenectady, N. Y., today won in the District of Columbia court of appeals its challenge of the federal radio commission's power to restrict its time of operation on a wave length previously allotted to it.

The commission ordered the station to divide its time or operation on the air with a California station operated by the same company. The time involved included the valuable early evening hours. The company appealed.

Today's decision directs the commission to renew the company's permit for WGY to operate full time on its channel and in effect upholds the company's claim to a "vested interest" in the air.
