## Smart Sports Clothes Necessary

NEW YORK, Mar. 18.—(U.P.)—From supplying the main motif to a becoming attire in the spring song of fashion is the fate of sports wear this season. It has been decidedly soft pedalled, the refrain being the late afternoon frock, sleeveless or otherwise.

There is of course a definite need for sports wear, and that it is confined to the purposes for which it was originally intended has not dampened the enthusiasm of women who live the great part of the day out of doors. For

the type of sports ensemble which is decidedly practical combines a light skirt with matching unlined, knee-length jacket and a jersey jumper. It is youthful, and supplies sufficient warmth to keep up for the lack of jacket lining. The skirt is usually designed so that the jumper may be tucked in or worn over the outside.

As a rule, the jacket is on cardigan lines, though it may sometimes be open close, with a round, collarless neckline.

Emphasis is placed on the brighter colors, in blue, green and red, the latter being particularly favored. The jersey jumpers are usually harmonized, though the white jumper is another important part of the vogue.

Blouse blouses are also shown in smart shops and will probably be more in evidence later. Where the blouse is silk, a leading combination of that of the red tweed with white blouse applied in red and black stripes. Frequently, with either the jersey or silk blouse, the blouse is darker than the suit, in such combinations as dark brown jersey with tan skirt, or black with red.

### Young Woman Challenges Air Supremacy Of Men

San Francisco, Mar. 18.—(U.P.)—Supremacy of the air, held by men since the Wright Brothers made the first flight 25 years ago was challenged today by a young woman who remained aloft alone for more than 22 hours.

Mrs. Louise McPhetridge Thaden, 23, new holder of the world's endurance flight record for feminine pilots, claimed today the time would soon come when women would threaten flight records of men.

Mrs. Thaden landed her Travelair biplane at Oakland airport at 1:54 p. m. Sunday to conclude a solo flight or 22 hours, three minutes and 12 seconds. She was not satisfied and said that with an ample supply of fuel she could have remained up 13 hours longer to equal the men's endurance record. She also holds the woman's altitude record of 20,400 feet, made last fall.
