Once upon a time there was a big, big raffle. Mrs. Freeman drew the lucky number and a pair of the finest bronze turkeys you have, or haven't ever seen. She took them to her home at Ardenode, a 24-mile stone's throw from Calgary, Canada, and for awhile they were very, very happy.

But, alas, they realized that their lives were quite empty, until one day Mrs. Turkey had a nice flock of youngsters running about her.
