AN ORDINANCE

Prohibiting the construction of wood shingle roofs, the repair and construction of roofs and dormer windows within the corporate limits of the city of Decatur, Indiana, giving power to condemn roofs in a deteriorated condition, providing a penalty for the violation thereof, and declaring an emergency.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Common Council of the city of Decatur, Indiana:

Section I

All buildings, except those specifically mentioned in Section II of this Ordinance, shall have roofs of coverings of standard quality, such as:

(a) Brick or concrete surface.

(b) Clay or Portland cement tile.

(c) Tin or slate.

(d) Asbestos shingles 1/4 inch thick or thicker.

(e) Pitch of felt, built up type four or five plies gravel or slag surface.

(f) Asbestos asphalt, built up type four or five plies, smooth or grit surface.

Section II

All of the following classes of buildings may be covered with coverings set forth above in Section I of this Ordinance, or with standard Asphalt Rag Felt prepared roofing, or Asphalt Rag Felt shingles, or by other type of covering having equivalent fire resistive properties when approved and labeled by the Underwriters Laboratories, Inc., Chicago, Ill.:

(a) Dwellings.

(b) Frame buildings.

(c) Buildings not exceeding two stories, or 30 feet in height, and 3,000 square feet in area, and not used for factories, warehouses or mercantile purposes.

Section III

The top and sides of dormer windows shall be covered same as the roof, or with other material having equivalent fire resistive properties.

Section IV

If a wood shingle roof is damaged by a fire more than 20 per cent, the entire roof shall be replaced with material specified in Section I and II of this Ordinance.

Section V

If a wood shingle roof is to be repaired more than 10 per cent in any way, the same shall be entirely replaced with material specified in Section I and II of this Ordinance, except as specified in paragraph 1 of this section.

Section VI

The building inspector or fire chief shall have power to condemn and have removed any wood shingle roof that in his opinion is in such a deteriorated condition as to be excessively inflammable.

Section VII

Within twelve (12) years
