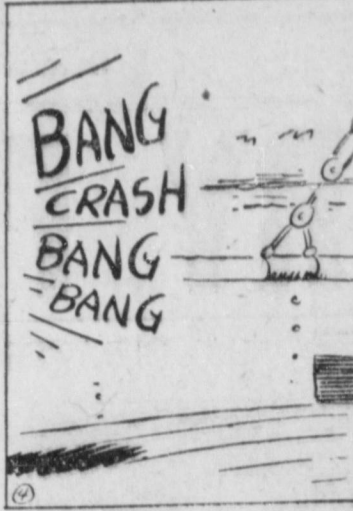

Indianapolis, May 8.—(UP)—Indianapolis became a city of plumes today as 2,000 representatives from 60 Knights Templar commanderies of Indiana paraded, drilled and dined in honor of the lodge's diamond jubilee. From an early breakfast and a tour through the new Scottish Rite cathedral, until the parade set for 4:30 p. m., the city flung out a carpet of hospitality for the tread of Knights Templar delegates and their wives.

Earthquake Causes Heavy
Damage In New Zealand

Auckland, New Zealand, May 9.—(UP)—(Thursday)—Damage of many thousands of pounds was caused by an earthquake which rocked this island at 3:45 a. m. today. Buildings were wrecked, chimneys knocked down, and in some cases the populace thrown into a panic. The tremor was felt from Wanganui-Palmerston all the way across the island to Napier. It was said to be the worst in six years. Hunterville, Fielding and Marton in the interior were severely hit. At Hunterville the ground rose up and down like a "bucking horse."

Valparaiso University

Student Receives Honor

Valparaiso, Ind., May 8.—(UP)—Errett R. Cooper, 22, Laporte, a student here, in Valparaiso university, has been elected a member of England's Royal Academy of Arts as a doctor of oratory, the youngest member the academy has ever had. Only six other Americans have been chosen for the honor since 1846. They were: John C. Calhoun, Charles Sumner, Samuel L. Clemens, William Jennings Bryan, William Arnold Fonner, and Robert M. LaFollette.

Only two other men now living on the entire North American continent hold the honor today. They are Dr. William A. Fonner, and Dr. James Scott Hodd, of Montreal, Canada. Reed received notice of his election in a personal letter from the Duke of Marlborough, John Alan Churchill, of Oxford, England. The duke said Reed had been proposed for election by Sir William Haig, Earl of Salisbury.

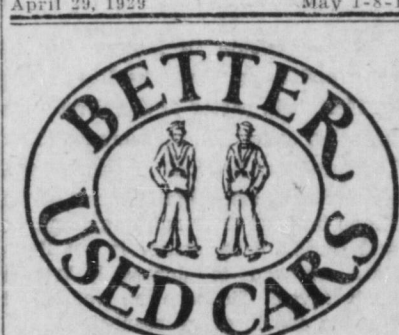
