be used against the young scale, summer treatments are not usually practical since it is very difficult to reach all parts of the infested tree when in foliage. Oftentimes, considerable value can be obtained by using a forceful stream of water to dislodge the cottony masses and recently hatched young. This must be done before many of the young have hatched to get the best results. In fact, where water pressure is available, it is strongly recommended that be practiced during July.
