Clear Way For Ex-Kaiser To Return To Germany

Berlin, June 26—(UP)—The former Kaiser's virtual exile from Germany will end in a few weeks with the expiration of the defense of the republic law on July 22.

The Reichstag, in one of the most heated debates of the year, refused to prolong the law, and when the session was over early today the sponsors of the measure stood defeated by a vote of 263 for prolongation to 166 against, a two thirds vote being necessary to pass the bill.
