### STORM STRIKES EL PASO, TEXAS

#### Damage Estimated At \$100,000 Caused By Near Cloudburst

El Paso, Tex., July 12.—(UP)—Damage estimated at \$100,000 was left in the wake of a heavy storm that assumed the proportions of a cloudburst in El Paso and vicinity last night, piling debris, sand and slime several feet deep in the thoroughfares.

Rumbling down the side of Mount Franklin, a wall of water swept into the city, carrying rock, gravel and sand which in some streets caused the torrent to run six feet deep.

Automobiles were picked up and hurled through store windows and doors were battered in by rocks hurled about by the flood.

The waters settled in the low part of the city in a lake several feet deep, causing many abode houses to collapse. No casualties were reported.

ported the news coming from the Dakotas and Montana as the most sensational bullfish he has witnessed in 25 years, and while the government figures for spring wheat were 254,000,000 bushels, reliable sources were giving estimates, that would indicate a probable crop as low as 160,000,000 bushels.

That the farmers of the United States should profit over the wheat raisers of Canada on the changed outlook, and perhaps have a chance to receive a greater total sum for their crop than was suggested, when prospects were most bright, is indicated by the official reports of the two countries. The Canadian statement showed a loss of approximately 200,000,000 bushels from last year's crop, while the Washington estimate was only 70,000,000 bushels short of the 1928 total.

Gary, Ind., July 12.—(UP)—More than 300 lawyers assembled from throughout the state today heard Judge Grant Crumpacker, Porter circuit court at Valparaiso, discuss problems facing jurists in their interpretation of civil and criminal law.
