

Woman Seeks Divorce

The complaint sets out the fact that the couple were married in November, 1914, and separated on July 14, 1929. The plaintiff alleges that the defendant is guilty of cruel and inhuman treatment. 49 Boys Worried Over Impending Brain Battle With Thomas A. Edison

East Orange, N. J., July 31.—(UPI)—The brain battle which they will wage with Thomas A. Edison had 49 boys somewhat worried today.

Tomorrow the boys—representing every state and the District of Columbia—will take an examination to determine who is the "logical successor" of Edison in the world of science. The winner will get as his prize the Edison scholarship which entitles him to tuition in any technical school he chooses.

All of the five judges are due tomorrow. Dr. S. W. Stratton, president of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology; Dr. Lewis Perry, headmaster of Phillips-Exeter Academy; and George Eastman already are here. Col. Charles A. Lindbergh and Henry Ford are due tomorrow.

Included in the candidates is Bernhard Sturgis, Butler, Ind.


