In his speech, Stresemann also expressed the hope that the Anglo-American naval negotiations would lead to an agreement and make disarmament also possible in the near future.

He said the cardinal achievement of the Hague reparations conference was the emancipation of German territory from foreign military occupation.

Stresemann recalled that before Germany entered the league, many Germans demanded a sweeping settlement of the problems left by the war as a condition of Germany's adherence. "But Germany," he said, "opposed this demand and has never regretted its participation in the league's activities although it has painfully felt the occupation of German soil."

Stresemann's collaboration with the United States of Europe project was today's feature of the League of Nations tenth assembly, now entering on its second week.


