## Says Trips To Girls' Schools Are Harmful

New Haven, Conn., Sept. 27.—(UP)—President James Rowland Angell believes the week-end trips Yale students make to girls' colleges are "disastrous, disintegrating and harmful physically and mentally."

Addressing students at a convocation, Angell condemned the "week-end exodus" and threatened to make all students register in New Haven Sunday if trips to New York, Poughkeepsie (site of Vassar college) and Northampton (site of Smith college) were not curtailed.

"Week-ends should be spent in New Haven making social contacts, an essential part of the college career," he said, adding that the Yale spirit was harmed by the present custom. There was no applause.

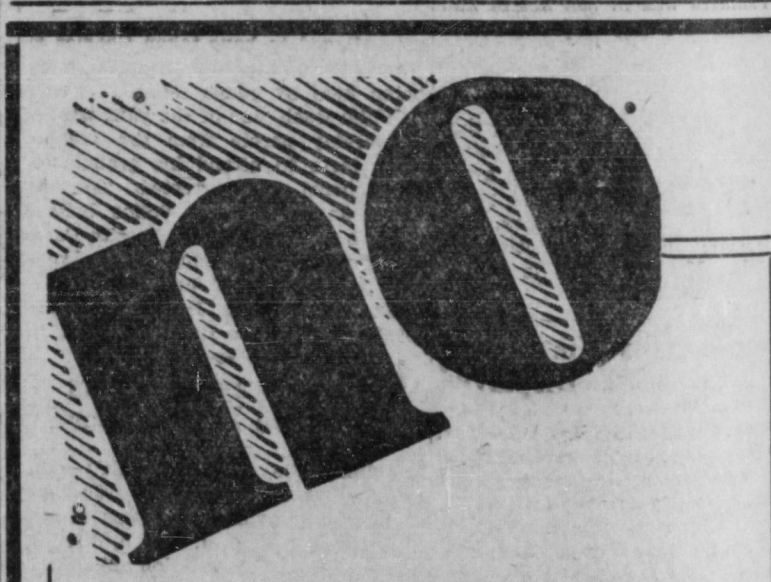
