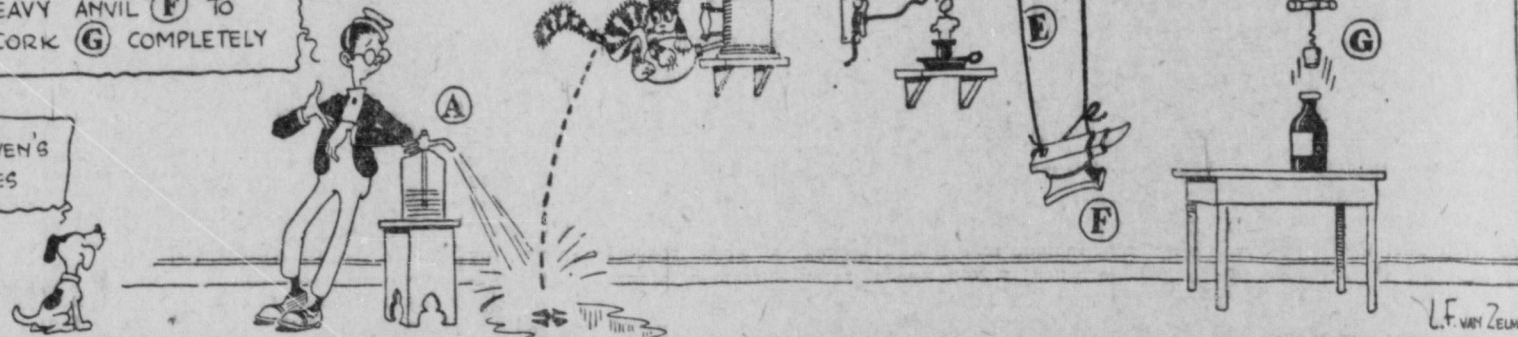

### Seek Bandits Who Held Up Gay Party

Champaign, Ill., Nov. 11.—(U.P.)—Six-  
ty financiers, high army officers, edu-  
cators and society notables who were  
robbed of \$54,000 in money and jewel-  
ry at a dance at the mansion here of  
Henry H. Harris, wealthy president  
of the General Alloys company of  
Boston, hoped to recover their valu-  
ables as police today sought through-  
out the state for two or the bandit  
quartet who escaped.

One bandit died early today in a  
hospital and another was in jail as an  
aftermath of the spectacular holdup  
Saturday night. Harris had invited  
100 guests to his showplace home to  
celebrate the Army-Illinois football  
game, and about 60 had arrived when  
the bandits turned the festivities into  
a gun battle.

### Steps Taken To Prevent Uprisings

Mexico City, Nov. 11.—(U.P.)—Pre-  
cautions against disorders in the final  
week of the Presidential campaign  
were re-doubled today as the capital  
recovered from bloody street fighting  
between supporters of rival candidates.  
Three dead and possibly 25 wound-  
ed, including a woman and a child, was  
announced as the toll of a clash last  
night when pistol fire and a barrage  
of bricks and stones started during a  
parade of 5,000 supporters of Jose Vas-  
concelos, Anti-re-electionist candidate  
for president.
