Chinese Missionary Returns Unharm

Peiping, China, Nov. 29.—(UP)—Mrs. Oscar Hallstead, American Missionary who was kidnapped near the border of Honan and Hupeh Provinces early in the week, has been released unharm by her captors, advices received here today said.

Mrs. Hallstead, treasurer of the Lutheran United Mission, was kidnapped from her home at Sinyen, Honan. Her native residence is Scandinavia.

Byrd Commences South Pole Trip

New York, Nov. 29.—(U.P.)—The New York Times, the St. Louis Post Dispatch and the newspapers affiliated with them in publishing reports from Commander Richard E. Byrd's Antarctic expedition have announced that Commander Byrd started from his base, Little America in the Antarctic, at 3:28 p.m. yesterday (10:29 p.m. E.S.T.) on a 1,600 mile flight to the south pole and back.

Commander Byrd, who is flying with Bernt Balchen as pilot, Harold Gurn as radio operator and Captain Ashley C. McKinley as photographer in a big tri-motored Ford airplane, expected to be in direct communication throughout the flight with the New York Times radio station.
