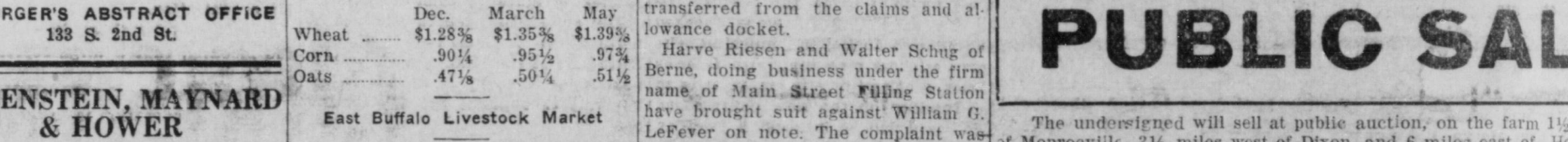
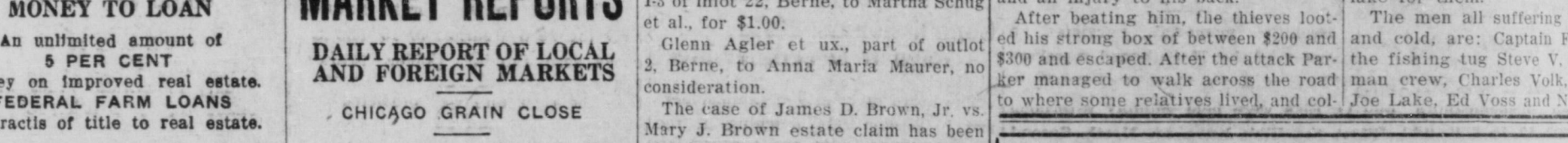
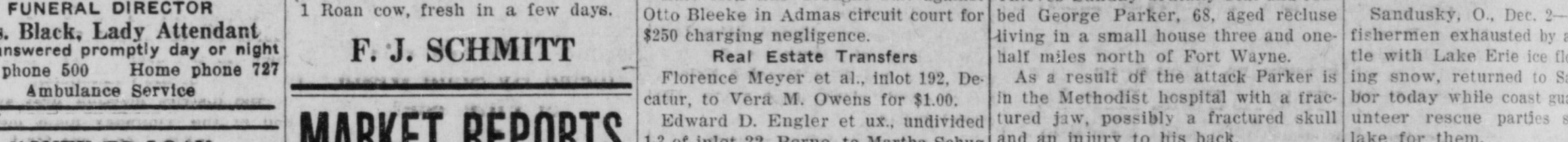

Grain Steamer Sinks

Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., Dec. 2.—(U.P.)—The battered bulk of the grain steamer Kiowa, pounding on the rocks off Sable Point in Lake Superior today, told graphically of a winter tragedy of the inland seas in which six sailors perished Saturday night in one of the most furious blizzards ever known on the Great Lakes.
Heroism of coast guardsmen, who battled mountainous waves and treacherous rocks to get a line across the Kiowa's bow, saved the other 18 aboard. The survivors, almost dead from exposure and exhaustion were transferred from the wave-lashed wreck to the bobbing boats of the rescuers by breeches buoy.

Conduct Search For Missing Aviator

Cleveland, Dec. 2.—(U.P.)—A squadron of four air mail planes took off here this morning in a widespread search for Pilot Thomas P. Nelson believed to have crashed against the icy slopes of the Allegheny mountains near Clarion, Pa.

Nelson left Bellefonte, Pa., in a plane at 11:55 p. m. and was due in Cleveland at 2:15 a. m. At 12:45 a. m. his plane was heard over Brookville, Pa., and then vanished into the blinding snow storm that whipped western Pennsylvania.

The squadron from Cleveland was directed by Wesley L. Smith, crack N. A. T. flyer and division superintendent with headquarters here.
