E. Burt Lenhart was named executor and filed bond in the sum of \$20,000.

The will provides that all just debts be paid and that a grandson Theodore Heller receive \$500. The widow Carrie Scirry receives 80 acres in Kirkland township to be hers until death. The property then goes to a son, William F. Scherry.

Forty acres in Kirkland township are bequeathed to the widow and then at the time of her death to two sons, Lewis Scherry and William F. Scherry, share and share alike.

William F. Scherry is to receive the best team of horses on the Scherry farm and all necessary farm implements to enable him to farm. The rest is to be divided between William and Lewis and Susie Corson, share and share alike.
