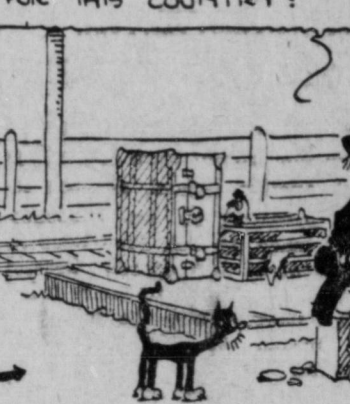

He told his landlady last night that the years were all the same for him, "no home, no money, friends."

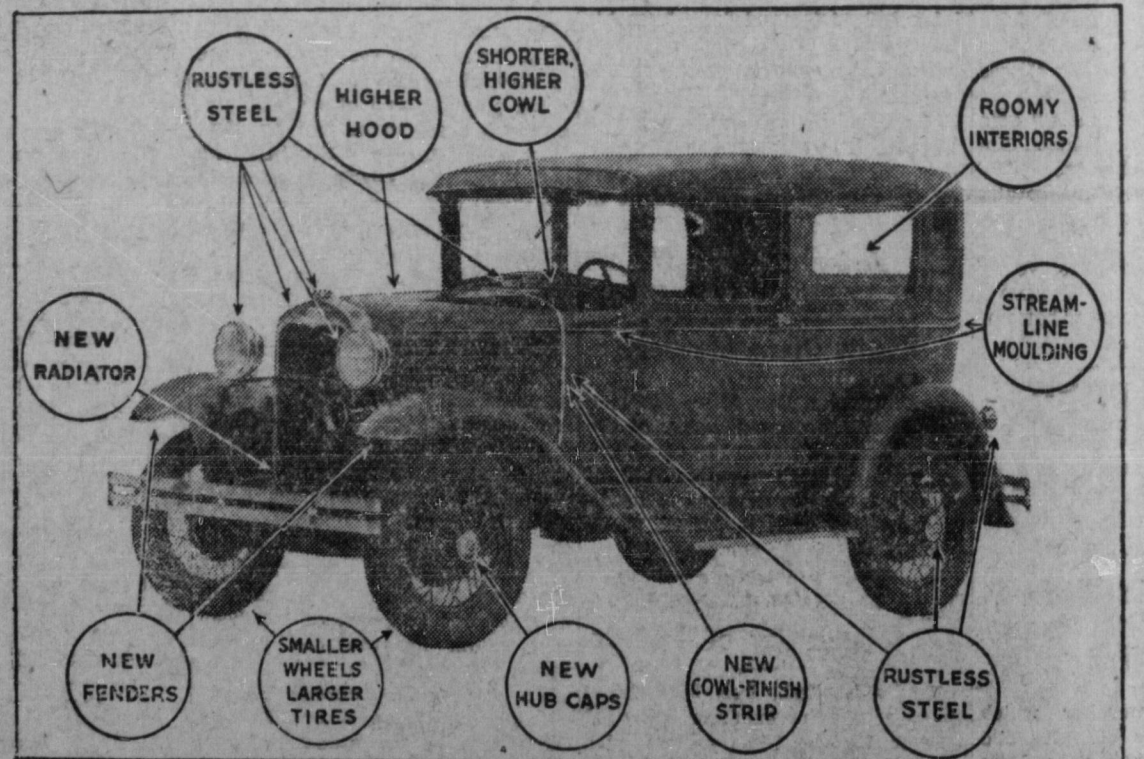
"This one will be same, 1930 will be another 1929, so—here goes."
