Decker, Ind., April 3.—(U.P.)—The ban on public meetings and schools sessions at Decker probably will be lifted Monday, with the threat of spinal meningitis believed checked. Dr. E. H. Frigge, county health officer has announced.

Investigation of the throats of several persons will be made this week, Dr. Frigge said, and if there are no further outbreaks or serious developments, the ban will be removed, he said.

To Test New Law

Indianapolis, April 3.—(U.P.)—Test of the 1929 statute to standardize terms of prosecutors throughout the state will be made in Sullivan county, it was revealed today.
Earl S. Cummings, democratic primary candidate for prosecutor at Sullivan, has filed a mandamus suit in Sullivan circuit court to require the Secretary of State Otto G. Piffle to certify his name for the election ballot.

Although accepting filings of candidates from all counties, Piffle has refused to certify those affected by the new law, upon advice of Attorney General James M. Ogden. This paved the way for the suit testing constitutionality.
