To Lift Quarantine

Decker, Ind., April 3—(UPI)—The ban on public meetings and schools sessions at Decker probably will be lifted Monday, with the threat of spinal meningitis believed checked. Dr. E. H. Frigge, county health officer has announced.

Investigation of the threats of several persons will be made this week, Dr. Frigge said, and if there are no further outbreaks or serious developments, the ban will be removed, he said.

Dr. Frigge reported there are no cases of the disease in Decker at present.


