**Fourteen Start Trip
To Federal Prison**

Terre Haute, Ind., June 23. — (U.P.) — Fourteen men were started from here today, enroute to the Federal prison at Leavenworth, Kan., where they will serve terms ranging from one year and one day to two years, imposed upon them by Judge Robert C. Baltzell in Federal court here last week.

The men were sentenced as a result of their conviction on charges of conspiracy to violate the Federal prohibition laws. They were indicted by a Federal grand jury in Indianapolis on a charge that they operated a gigantic liquor ring of 38 stills in Vermillion and Vigo counties.

Twelve of the 46 men named in the indictment, including Joe Traum, alleged leader of the ring, and Eddie O'Hara, Traum's lieutenant, have not yet been tried, either having foreclosed bond or not yet been apprehended.

CLEAN GRAIN BINS

TO THWART WEEVIL

Lafayette, Ind., June 23 — Thorough cleaning of the grain bin before putting in newly harvested and threshed grain is the first important step in preventing damage from grain weevils, according to Prof. J. J. Davis, head of the entomology department, of the Purdue University agricultural experiment station. Grain weevils, Prof. Davis says, are a continual source of loss to farmers, but their damage may be greatly reduced by taking proper precautions.
