Terre Haute, Ind., Oct. 9. (U.P.)—Forfeiture of the \$10,000 bond of Joe Traut, alleged leader of the Wabash Valley liquor ring and now serving a term in Leavenworth penitentiary, was ordered by Judge Robert C. Baltzell at the close of the October term of federal court, southern Indiana district.

Suit to prevent collection of the bond was instituted after Traut was captured in Chicago and sentenced to a prison term. Judge Baltzell ruled that Traut had not appeared on the date set for trial that the court was powerless to change its previous order for forfeiture.

New York, Oct. 9. (U.P.)—Charles Augustus Lindbergh, Jr., will choose his own career when he comes of age, according to an interview with his father in the November issue of the Pictorial Review.

Col. Lindbergh laughed when the interviewer asked him about his present plans for his son's future.

"Our son has hardly reached the age to have his future determined for him," the Colonel was quoted as saying, "and in any case, it is

a question he can best decide for himself when the time comes."
