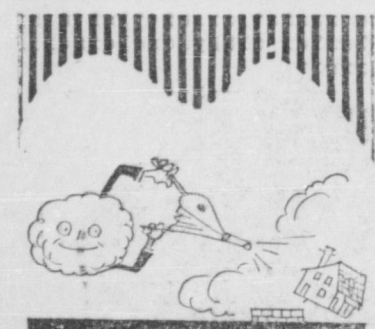

NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

M. during the tax paying season. All taxes not paid by that time will become delinquent and a 10% penalty will be added. Call on the Auditor for errors and any reductions. The Treasurer can make no corrections. The Treasurer will not be responsible for the penalty of delinquency resulting from the commission of tax-payer to state definitely on what property, they desire to pay, in whose name it may be paid, in what township or corporation it is situated. Persons owing delinquent taxes should pay them at once, the law is such that there is no option left for the treasurer but enforce the collection of delinquent taxes. The annual sale of delinquent lands and lots will take place on the second Monday in February 1931 at 10:00 A. M. County orders will not be paid to anyone owing delinquent taxes. All persons are warned against them. No receipts will be held after expiration of time, as the new depositor's law requires the Treasurer to make daily deposits. Particular attention: If you pay taxes in more than one township, mail the fact to the Treasurer, also a check that your receipts call for all your real estate and personal property. New York, Oct. 16.—(U.P.)—Winter jobs for at least 10,000 unemployed persons will be created in New York as the result of the formation of a committee of prominent bankers and business men, who have promised to raise \$150,000 a week for the needy.

The money will be distributed through the Charity Organization Society and the Association for Improving the Condition of the Poor. Work will be found for needy heads of families on a five-day basis, and the pay will be \$3 a day.
