Gary, Ind., Oct. 17. -U-P- Allen P. Warren, Evansville, a Vanderburg county commissioner, was elected president of the county commissioners association of Indiana at the close of the twenty-seventh annual convention at Gary yesterday. He will succeed William P. Linton, Crown Point, a Lake county commissioner.

The 1931 meeting of the body will be held in Evansville during the first week of October. Edward H. Matthew, Anderson, was elected vice president and John McGregor, Indianapolis, was re-elected secretary-treasurer.

William Holland, Indianapolis, secretary of the Indiana Highway Construction Association, urged the commissioners to attempt unemployment relief by letting contracts for public improvements during the present depression.
