County orders will not be paid to anyone owing delinquent taxes. All persons are warned against them.

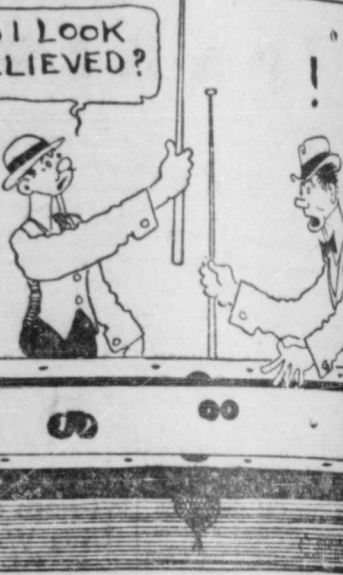
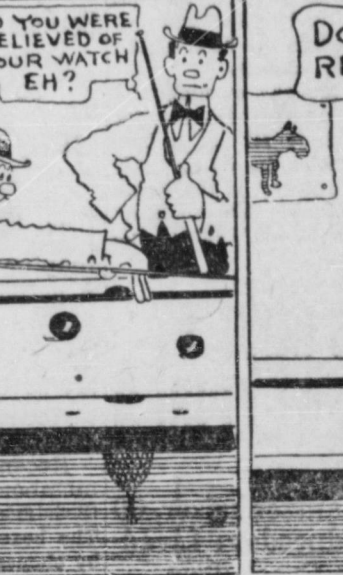
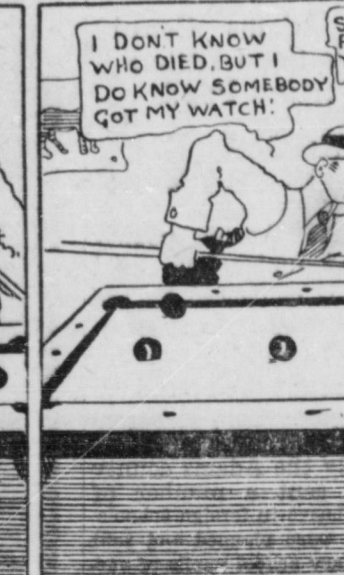
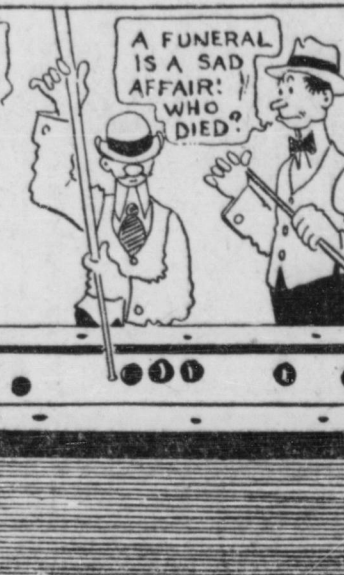
No receipts will be held after expiration of time, as the new delinquent law requires the Treasurer to make daily deposits.
