The noble experiment seems to have turned to ignominious failure.

Governor Leslie plans watch towers to catch criminals but we are fearful it would take an awful lot of towers and think of the profit in building them, the cost to the taxpayers and other expenses for maintenance and we doubt if it would prove an economical or efficient method.

We need a few changes in the constitution of Indiana but that should not mean that we should destroy the old document for an uncertain new one. Such an effort will cost a lot of money and you have no guarantee that you won't get one much worse than the present one. Chances are you will if you write one now. The safe thing is vote "NO" next Tuesday.

The administration in Washington is so frightened about the outcome of the election that a frantic effort is being made to save the situation. Cabinet members are radioing and every senator and congressman who can get away from his own ballwick is out "in the bushes" trying to convince the voters that the reference to "sons of wild jackasses" was just a bit of humor.

The three suspects held for robbery at the Broadway State Bank at Fort Wayne, August 20th, were found guilty and sent up for fifteen years. They claimed their innocence but were identified by several Fort Wayne people who saw them and besides that admitted their business was banditry, so they are not getting much the worse of the break. These characters are safer behind the walls

of prison.  
Vote next Tuesday. Its your privilege and a great one if you use it as you should. Those citizens who complain between elections and then fail to vote should not be given much consideration. Even two years ago when interest was at white heat, less than sixty per cent of the eligible vote was cast. There is a probability that unless some intensive work is done the next few days a light vote will be cast. Don't let that happen. Get busy and help get out the vote.

Are you dissatisfied with the so-called "Republican Prosperity"? They are promising you a continuation of it. A vote for the democratic ticket next Tuesday means a vote in protest of the slipshod methods in government which have brought about one of the worst depressions ever known in this country. Send new men to Washington, change the personnel in the state house, be sure to elect democrats to the legislature. Its an important duty.

There is nothing the republican state organization and the state house crowd so much fear as the election of a democratic legislature next Tuesday. That fear is easy to understand. It is the reason that so much of a drive has been put into the effort to elect republican candidates for the Indiana house of representatives. Democratic control of the legislature, or even of the lower branch of it, will open the way to needed and effectual investigations of the state government. It will permit an examination of the governor's accounts with respect to his emergency fund. It will permit an examination of the state highway department, which long has needed such an examination. It will permit the learning of many a why and wherefore in the office of the secretary of the secretary of state, in the office of the state auditor. Indiana never has stood so greatly in need of a change in political control in the legislature as now. Happily there is glowing promise that such a change is at length to come about. The people of Indiana ought to be in no doubt of the necessity to elect a democratic legislature this year if they are to have their state government made responsive and responsible to the citizenship of the commonwealth. The party in power has been in power too long. It has assumed itself to have a separate and selfish interest in the government of the state and its representatives in office have been asserting a proprietary control of it.—Fort Wayne Journal-Gazette.

**DOLLAR URGES GREATER DRIVE FOR TOURISTS**

**Veteran Believes Pacific Organizations Should Co-ordinate**

Tokyo. —(UP)—Transportation lines, tourist organizations and government bureaus throughout the Pacific areas should coordinate their efforts to promote tourist travel in the Orient, Captain Robert Dollar, veteran head of the Dollar Steamship Lines said in an interview here recently.  
"Americans travel to Europe literally by the hundreds of thousands every year," Captain Dollar said, and they spend hundreds of millions of dollars. As a shipping man interested primarily in the Pacific I would like to see more of travel come to the Orient. We have heard a lot about the 'Pacific Era' and it seems to me Americans might do well to see it first hand, in increasing numbers, the area in which this 'era's dawning."  
Captain Dollar, 86 years old and 'oremost among American steamship operators, said the primary purpose of his trip—one of more than a score he has made to the Orient—is to promote trade "tourist and general." He thought more ports and tourist centers would be essential as the tourist traffic develops. He was enthusiastic about a new inter-land steamship service his organization is opening in the Philippines.
