Park Animals in Huddle

Salt Lake City, Utah, Jan. 3—(UP)—Nature lovers are missing a great thrill during the winter season.

If they would take a week off and visit Yellowstone National Park they would see great herds of elk, deer and buffalo, that have sought company during a hard winter.

David Madsen, supervisor of game resources in national parks, made a trip through the park and reported one herd of 300 antelope, a herd of 5,000 elk, 800 buffalo and 500 deer.

With the exception of a few drifts it is possible to cross the park by auto from Mammoth Springs to West Yellowstone.
