would be completed that day.

Two Indianapolis aliens, Dr. Charles D. Humes and Dr. E. Rogers Smith, who were appointed by the court to examine Schroeder and observe him during the trial, announced last evening that they had completed their work, and were ready to testify for the court when state and defense testimony is in. Their testimony might decide either between an insane ward and the electric chair, or between an insane ward and freedom.

Schroeder told Sheriff Winkler and me that he would go with us Illinois, and point out the spot where he said he ran into a ditch, Golder testified. "We all got into the emergency car and started for Illinois. When we got to the Marion-Hendricks county line, Schroeder said he wouldn't go with us."

"Where I ran off into the ditch doesn't concern this case and I won't tell you where it was," Golder quoted Schroeder as saying.

George W. Eggleston, former deputy prosecutor, testified that Schroeder told him he "wanted to become legally dead." The statement was alleged to have been made during questioning of Schroeder concerning the auto-pyre death.
