"Fairy" Only in Name

Fairy rings are rings observed in pastures, distinguished from surrounding vegetation by being either barer or more luxuriant, and attributed by the peasants of western Europe to the dancing of the fairies. They are now known to be occasioned by the growth of certain kinds of fungi, which proceeding outward from a center, render the soil for a time unfit for the nourishment of grass, but later fertilize it by their decay.

Civil War Bounty Jumpers

A bounty jumper in the Civil war was one who upon payment of bounty enlisted for the army and afterward deserted from the service. Usually a man who did this successfully once repeated the performance until he had accumulated quite a sum of money or was caught at the game.

Center of "Cold Pole"

The lowest temperature on the earth occurs in winter in the northeast part of Siberia, the same what indefinite center of greatest cold, being known as the "cold pole." At Verkhoyansk, in this region, a temperature of 90.4 degrees below Zero Fahrenheit, was recorded on January 15, 1885, the lowest ever recorded near the ground at regular meteorological station.

Immortal Work of Art

"The Death of Socrates" painted in 1785 and exhibited in the Paris salon in 1787, is the work of Jacques Louis David. It is one of the four paintings classed as the artist's masterpieces and shows the Greek philosopher about to drink poison in a well surrounded by his disciples. Sir Joshua Reynolds, who saw the painting at Paris, described it as the greatest effort of art since the Sistine Chapel and the Stanze of Raphael. In 1812 Napoleon tried to purchase it, but was not successful.

Ladder Superstition

The origin of the superstition about walking under a ladder is not known. It probably arises from the fact that in very early times the culprits were often hanged from ladders propped against buildings. Believers in the superstition say that bad luck will follow those who walk under a ladder, unless he makes a wish. In England the superstition has it that an unmarried woman who walks under a ladder will not be married for a year. To those believing this superstition it is also considered unlucky to walk on a ladder lying on the ground.
