(CONTINUED FROM PAGE ONE) will rise to 26 feet. The flood stage is 19 feet.

At Vincennes, where the rainfall was 151 inches, the Wabash was 13.1 feet and the Wabash, Terre Haute reported the Wabash was 16.9 and rising. The flood stage is 14 feet.

The east fork of the White river was rising at Shelbyville, where the precipitation was 1.07 inches. At Decker it was at a level of 22.6 feet and rising. The precipitation there was 1.25 inches. Armstrong predicted the White river would rise to a level of 26 feet at Shoals.

The Ohio river at Evansville was reported falling, having not yet felt the effects of the heavy rain of the past 24 hours.
