school when he was 17 years old. He took a post graduate course the following year.

Later he entered Rush Medical College, in Chicago, and in June, 1902, was graduated from that institution with a degree of Doctor of Medicine. He returned to Decatur and engaged in a general medical practice for two years. He then entered the Chicago Eye, Ear, Nose and Throat Institute and was graduated from that institution two years later. In his general practice he specialized in diseases of the eye, ear, nose and throat and was considered a specialist in his profession.

In following the practice of medicine, Dr. Coverdale was of the third generation engaged in that profession. His grandfather, Dr. Lemuel N. Coverdale practiced medicine about a century ago in Ohio, and his father was one of the pioneer doctors in this section of the country. His father began the practice of medicine at Monmouth in 1872. Dr. Coverdale's father died in this city, December 31, 1928.

Following his graduation from college, Dr. Coverdale was associated with his father and until the latter's death they had their office together.

On May 24, 1911, he married Miss Estella Ellis of this city. They have one daughter, Mary Madeline, who is a senior in the Decatur high school.

In War Service

When the United States entered the World war, Dr. Coverdale was named chief examiner of the Adams County medical examination board. He served as chairman of the conscription board until called to active service in the medical corps of the army. He was commissioned a captain and in September, 1918, was sent to Fort Oglethorpe, Chattanooga, Tenn. He remained in the service until January, 1919, and was discharged from New York, being an officer in an embarkation unit.

Following the war he returned to Decatur and resumed his practice. He was active in fraternal circles and served several terms as exalted ruler of Decatur council No. 993 of the R. P. O. E. He also served as lodge trustee for several years and a week ago was named an alternate to the national convention of Elks at Birmingham, Ala.

Besides the widow and daughter, Dr. Coverdale is survived by one brother, Clark Coverdale of Demopolis, Alabama. Word was received from him this afternoon that he would be here Friday morning. One sister, May Coverdale, Christian died several years ago.

The body was removed late this afternoon from the Black undertaking parlors to the Coverdale home, accompanied by an escort of Legionnaires.

Friends may view the body from seven to nine o'clock Thursday and Friday evenings and from two to four Friday afternoon.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2:30 o'clock Saturday afternoon from the Presbyterian church. The Rev. A. R. Fiedler, pastor of the Zion Reformed church, will deliver the sermon. The Rev. Harry Thompson, will assist. The Scottish Rite will conduct ritualistic services at the church.

Burial will be made in the Decatur cemetery.
