ESPECIALLY RESPONDING  
TO RICH SOIL: Castor-bean, scarlet sage, balsam, and China-aster.

## TO CUT FOR EVERLASTINGS: Rose everlasting, feathered cockscomb, globe-amaranth, and straw-flower.

NOT ADAPTED TO THE SOUTH: Except for late and early spring: Salpiglossis, pansy and forget-me-not.

Plants that can be started to advantage in hotbeds and cold-frames for early flowering, whether they are to be used for bedding purposes or for cut flowers: Ageratum, China-aster, caliopsis, castor-bean, calendula, cosmos, cockscomb, chrysanthemum, eustoma, gilia, lantana, marigold, petunia, pink, snapdragon, spider-flower, stock and zinnia. Most of these may be sown earlier in a hotbed or coldframe and thus be made to bloom earlier.

Some plants that may be sown in beds in the open ground and later transplanted to their permanent locations are: ageratum, calendula, caliopsis, China-aster, Clarkia, cockscomb, dahlia, gallardia, godetia, lantana, mignonette, pansy, pink, snapdragon, spider-flower, stock and zinnia. Most of these may be sown earlier in a hotbed or coldframe and thus be made to bloom earlier.

## Steel Baron Dies

La Porte, Ind., Mar. 23.

W. E. Taylor, 79, who fought his way up through the steel industry to the general management of Republic Iron & Steel Co., Pittsburgh died here yesterday.

Taylor who had lived here for 30 years ago was born in Cleveland and entered the industry with the Globe Iron Works in 1889. He rose to the top of the firm and stepped from executive position to another when he became Republic general manager.
