The periodical cicada, popularly known as the 17-year locust, although it is not a locust, is bright green in color when just mature and then gradually becomes a dark brownish red in color. The 17-year variety often appears in the same territory as the 13-year variety, and when large numbers of both these broods appear together there is a veritable epidemic, such as there was in 1892.

First Train Tunnel
