NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS
Notice is hereby given that Monday, May 2, 1932, will be the last day to pay your Fall installment of taxes. The county treasurer's office will be open from 8 A. M. to 4 P. M. during the tax paying season. All taxes not paid by that time will become delinquent and a 10% penalty will be added. Those who have bought or sold property and wish a division of taxes are asked to come in at once.
Call on the Auditor for errors and any reductions. The Treasurer can make no corrections.
The Treasurer will not be responsible for the penalty of delinquent taxes resulting from the omission of taxpayer to state definitely on what property they desire to pay, in whose name it may be found, in what township or corporation it is situated.
Persons owing delinquent taxes should pay them at once, the law is such that there is no option left for the Treasurer but enforce the collection of delinquent taxes.
The annual sale of delinquent lands and lots will take place on the second Monday in February 1933 at 10:00 A. M.
County orders will not be paid to anyone owing delinquent taxes. All persons are warned against them.
No receipts or checks will be held what expiration of time, as the new delinquent law requires the Treasurer to make daily deposits.
Particular attention, if you pay taxes in more than one township mention the fact to the Treasurer also see that your receipts call for all your real estate and personal property.
In making inquiries of the Treasurer regarding taxes to insure reply do not fail to include return postage.



Non-Skid Streets
Paris, April 5.—(U.P.)—When Paris is fully equipped with her new concrete streets and roadways, covered with odd little grooves and artistic patterns, there will be no skidding.
The new preparation will not require any digging up of old roadways, but simply a re-coating of them with non-skid surfacing. In some cases the top asphalt will be removed and concrete substituted, specially grooved and prepared to retard the progress of vehicles in rainy weather.
Among the materials that have been tried are rubber, a mixture of cork and asphalt, which worked fairly well, brick, and pottery clay. Wooden blocks are used in some important streets but this is expensive due to the fact that, to be kept in good condition, they must be well aired, exposed and slightly sloping.
