FAIRLEY TAKES BIG LEAD IN 4TH DISTRICT

burn Manufacturer Is
Winner In Congress-
ional Nomination

HEAD PILES
UP HIGHER

BULLETIN

James I. Farley had an unop-
posed majority of 6,800 votes
in Allen County early this morn-
ing. Almost every precinct had
reported its results. Farley
carried DeKalk county by
more than 1,500.

Port Wayne, May 4. — James I. Farley, Auburn, wet, appeared to
be the winner in the seven-
cornered race for the Democratic
nomination for congress from
the fourth district. Farley swept Al-
len county and carried his own
home county by a nice vote.
T. A. Gottschalk of Berne, won
the county where James Adams,
Fonda City, led the field of seven.
Adams also carried Noble,
Smiley, and LaGrange counties but
by a sufficient amount to offset
the tremendous vote Farley piled
up in Fort Wayne.

Farley carried Steuben county
in Allen county. He was ex-
pected to win third place in the
district. Smiley, Riddle, and Far-
reman counted lightly and in many
precincts failed to get a vote.
Political leaders of Fort Wayne
agreed tonight that Farley would
secure the nomination by more
than 6,000, provided there were no
upsets.

Gottschalk drew a good general
vote but fell short in Allen county.
The final lineup probable will be
Farley, Adams, Gottschalk, Riddle,
Smiley, Farraar and Smiley.

Seven Go To Purdue

Seven young men and women of
Allen County, 4-H club winners,
left this morning for Purdue Uni-
versity, Lafayette, where they will
attend the 4-H Club Round-Up.

Young people were accom-
panied to Lafayette by County
Chairman L. E. Archbold and Miss
Kenney of Jefferson town-
ship. Lawrence Bluhm, one of the
winners, was unable to go on ac-
count of the severe injuries with
which his father suffered Monday
evening when he figured in a
automobile accident south of Mon-
tgomery.

left this morning to attend
Round-Up were Ruth Yale,
Weiland, Louise Shoemaker,
Mabel Mazelin, Estella Steury,
M. Schwartz, and Reinhold
Schwartz.

OMPSON WINS
ER MUSelman

County Man Nam-
ed Democrat Candidate
For Representative

Incomplete returns avail-
able early this morning, Frank G.
Thompson, Bluffton newspaperman,
appeared to be the winner in the
Democratic contest for nomination
of joint representative of Adams
and Wells counties over C. H.
Muselman, Berne publisher.

Thompson carried his home
county of Wells by about 1,800 votes
and was trailing Muselman in Ad-
ams county by about 500 votes with
less than 13 precincts to be heard.

Muselman conceded the nomin-
ation to Thompson when 33 of the
Wells county precincts gave
Thompson a lead of more than 1,
000 votes. The Democratic nomin-
ation is tantamount to election in
the district.
