Hems

When hemming linens, or similar articles, on the sewing machine, it will not be necessary to tie the ends of the threads if the material is turned around and stitched back for an inch or two.

Baking

After following a receipt for baking, make a note below the receipt of the temperature you found best and the length of time for baking. Different cakes require different methods of baking to get the best results.
