School Teacher Held For Slaying His Wife

Marshall, Ill., Aug. 18—(UP)—Hubert Moor, 32, Robinson, Ill., a school teacher, accused by a coroner's jury of slaying his wife, Margaret, Sunday night, was held in jail here today without bond. Hearing on Moor's petition for bond will be held Monday.

As a result of the charges against him, Moor today tendered his resignation as instructor of agriculture in the Robinson high school. Moor's wife was a substitute teacher in the school. Moor said he resigned as a matter of "duty" but protested that he was not guilty of the slaying.
