bust, the mayor suffered a partial collapse this week when his brother, George F. Walker, died.

A flurry of rumor, reports, speculations and contradictory statements attended the final chapter in the Walker case. For weeks he had maintained, first, that he would meet every issue "on its merits." Again, he had said that resignation was "furtherest from my mind."

But, returning from his brother's funeral yesterday, he went into re-

tirement for an hour or two, and afterward became the subject of a city-wide search. At various hours it was reported he was conferring with Tammany leaders—John F. Curry, John McCooey and other chieftains of the wigwam's board of strategy.

The rumor spread that "City Clerk Michael J. Cruise may have an important statement to make later on." Cruise is the official to whom the mayor's resignation was required, by law, to be sent.

The mayor was mysteriously absent from his luxurious apartment at the Mayfair hotel until 10 p.m., then suddenly reappeared, haggard and worn, to tell waiting reporters that a statement would be issued at city hall.

The statement, so hastily drawn that no time had been given for printing the document—or even for providing the manifolds needed by the press—was read to a small group of reporters. It was replete with biting sarcasm directed at Roosevelt and at the mayor's accusers.

Its theme was a single note—the unfairness of the governor's trial. The mayor characterized this trial as an "extraordinary inquisition." It was, he said, a "mock trial," a proceeding in comparison to which even the practice of a drumhead court martial seemed liberal.

The statement continued that Walker had been advised that "so far as courts are concerned at present I must submit to being outraged by the unlawful acts of the governor," and that he has "no remedy at the present time in the courts."

"This indefensible and lawless purpose of the governor," he continued, "has revealed itself through the hearing . . . He has not called upon the accusers, particularly Mr. Seabury, to provide any supporting proof."

Walker characterized the governor as "studiously unfair," charged him with acting as "a prosecutor although the law requires that he be coldly neutral" . . . and "an impartial judge."

With a hint of the sarcasm for which he is noted, the mayor said the governor had permitted questions and answers "that even a first-year law student would recognize were not permissible."

In defense of his activities as Mayor Walker set forth:

1. That not one witness has testified to any act . . . that was influenced by dishonest consideration.

2. That not one witness has testified that he sought or received any money, or anything, as consideration for an official act.

3. That not one witness had testified that he did anything . . . injuriously affecting the city of New York or its citizens.

4. That not one witness had testified that he caused . . . the loss
