Heavy Trucking Causes Heavy Damage to Low Type Roads This Year

Many of these roads, according to Hinkle, never had sufficient base to withstand the heavier loads even in dry weather, so under present conditions naturally are inadequate.

Maintenance forces, at his direction, are making repairs as rapidly as possible. In the meantime the public is asked to cooperate by lightening loads routed over these types. The maximum weight of the load and vehicle or unpaired roads, as when soft is three tons, in numerous instances and for short periods is advisable to make the weight even lighter, officials say.

Hinkle says since a hard freeze set in and gravel and stone roads and a light coat of metal, further trouble may be expected, many oil mat roads—ad this season. After each thaw between now and spring he anticipates some foundation breaks to develop and has instructed field forces to stand ready to expedite repairs in order to keep traffic moving at the least possible inconvenience.
