ent for the beer bill roll call, 49 votes would be necessary to stop passage of the measure.

But since the house vote thus far in the session has averaged only around 90, either through absence or avoidance, 38 votes with that average number voting would leave a majority of only 52 votes just one more than the constitutional majority required.
