Fuzzless Peach Nearing Perfection On Coast

Boise, Idaho. — (U.P.) — Development of a "fuzzless" peach which may be eaten without the customary irritation to the mouth, has made rapid progress in Idaho during the past season, farm agencies report.

The peach, technically termed as the "Candoka peach," is deep red in color, resembling somewhat an apple. It lacks down and may be ripened on the tree for shipment.

NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

Notice is hereby given that Monday, November 6, 1933, will be the last day of the year for the installation of taxes. The county treasurer's office will be open from 8 A. M. to 4 p. m. during the tax paying season. All taxes not paid by that time will be delinquent and a 3% penalty will be charged. Interest at the rate of 8% will be charged from the date of delinquency until paid. Those who have bought or sold property, and wish a division of taxes, are asked to come in at once.

Call on the Auditor for errors and any reductions. The errors can make no corrections.

The Treasurer will not be responsible for the penalty of delinquent taxes resulting from the omission of tax-payers to state definitely what property, they desire to pay, in whose name it may be found, in what township or corporation it is situated.

Persons owing delinquent taxes should pay them at once, the law is such that there is no option left for the Treasurer but enforce the collection of delinquent taxes.

The collection of delinquent lands and lots will take place on the second Monday in February 1934 at 10:00 A. M.

County orders will not be paid to anyone owing delinquent taxes. All persons owing delinquent taxes must pay them at once.

No receipts or checks will be held after expiration of time, as the new depository law requires the Treasurer to make daily deposit.

Particular attention, if you pay taxes in more than one township, mention the fact to the Treasurer, also see that your receipts call for all your real estate and personal property.

In making inquiries of the Treasurer regarding taxes to insure receipt do not fail to include return postage.
