NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS
Notice is hereby given that the Monday, November 6, 1933 will be the last day to pay your Fall installment of taxes. The county treasurer's office will be open from 8 A. M. to 4 p. m. during the Fall, paying taxes will become delinquent and a 3% penalty will be added. Also interest at the rate of 5% will be charged from the date of delinquency on all taxes not paid by the 6th. Those who have no property and wish to pay taxes are asked to come in at once. Call on the Auditor for errors and any reductions. The Treasurer can make a correct audit.

The Treasurer will not be responsible for the penalty of delinquent taxes resulting from the omission of tax-payers to state definitely on what property they desire to pay, those who have no property and what township or corporation it is situated.

Persons owing delinquent taxes should pay them at once, the law is stiff. The Treasurer has no time left for the collection of delinquent taxes.

The annual sale of delinquent lands and lots will take place on the second Monday in February 1934 at 12 o'clock. County orders will not be paid to anyone owing delinquent taxes. All persons are warned against them.

No receipts or checks will be held after expiration of time, as the new delinquent law requires the Treasurer to make daily deposit.

Particular attention. If you pay taxes in more than one township, mention the fact to the Treasurer so that your receipts call for all your real estate and personal property.

In making inquiries of the Treasurer regarding taxes to insure reply do not fail to let him know what your property is.

At 10:40 a. m. Lindbergh left the Crillon for the unannounced destination with Pierre Cot, youth and spectacle air minister, who recently became a licensed airplane pilot.
