YELLOW JACKETS TO OPEN SEASON FRIDAY, NOV. 17

Eighteen Games Scheduled; Opening Game With New Haven

Eighteen games are scheduled for the Decatur Yellow Jackets basketball squad, which started intensive training preparations this week under Herb Curtis, coach of the local squad for the past several seasons.

The schedule will open Friday, November 17, with Paul White's New Haven Bulldogs furnishing the opposition on the local hardwood. Ten home games and eight on the road are carded for the athletes.

Four teams not on last year's schedule have been added to the local schedule. LaPorte will play here December 8, while Berne and Jefferson, both Adams county schools, are back on the schedule after a several years' lapse. Wabash, the other newcomer on the Yellow Jacket schedule, will be played at Wabash.

Seven letter men from last season are out for practice this year. These men are Gerald and Paul Strickler, Cowan, Ehinger, Eady, Butler and Saunders. Blythe, a letter man two years ago, but out of school last year because of illness, is also back in uniform. Three of last year's regulars, Hill, Buffenbarger and Feasel, graduated.

Coach Curtis has divided his squad into two sections, with about 25 men in each section. Practice sessions are held daily.

PLAN BIG GAME FOR DECEMBER 9

Two of Country's Leading Teams Will Meet At Chicago

Chicago, Nov. 2—(UP)—A post-season game between two of the country's leading football teams has been announced for Soldier field, Chicago, Dec. 9, by a recently formed group of former college men to be known as the "National football championship committee."

Col. John B. Reynolds, president of the Chicago Rotary Club, has named chairman of the executive committee, which will include about 25 members from all sections of the country.

The rival teams will be selected by two committees, composed largely of sports writers in New York and Chicago.

The teams now considered in the running for selection are: East, Fordham, Army, Princeton, Dartmouth, and Colgate; Midwest, Michigan, Minnesota, Purdue, Nebraska; South Georgia and Duke; far west, Oregon and Oregon State. Southern California has a game scheduled for Dec. 9.

Charity will share in the proceeds of the game the announcement stated.

The only drawback to making the plan permanent, he said, is lack of sufficient funds. National Guardsmen would have to be employed, to augment the state police force and the soldiers probably would have to be paid from state police funds.

The blockades are manned by 25 National guardsmen and a few state police working in 12 hour shifts. The men are equipped with field telephones, located a quarter of a mile in each direction from the blockade.

All automobiles are stopped and the occupants questioned.

Lawton, Okla., Nov. 2—(UP)—A triple slaying in which a mother and her son were shot and a daughter clubbed to death was investigated here today.

Strange circumstances surrounded the violent death of Mrs. Robert F. Hayter, 50, her son, Sidney, 17, and daughter Nell, 14. The bodies were found in their home last night by police who broke in when neighbors became alarmed. No member of the family had been seen since last Friday.

URGE LEGION WAR ON CRIME

Philadelphia—(UP)—Mobilization of American Legion members in the war against prevention of crime was urged here in an article written by Col. Vincent A. Carroll, National Executive Committee member of the American Legion, and Assistant District Attorney.

"In many remote communities, legionnaires have served effectively in crime detection," Carroll wrote. "Post members have formed posses to apprehend fleeing criminals and, strengthened by their military training, have given over valuable co-operation to local police."

"But this service still could be more effective if they devoted their attention to crime prevention as well as to detection, particularly in the smaller communities not policed with the thoroughness of a large city."

"There, for example, they might be constantly alert to detect suspicious characters and report their presence to the civil authorities. Many crimes are averted in large cities by this unseen and generally unrecognized vigilance of metropolitan police forces."

Marion City Fireman Accidentally Killed

Marion, Ind., Nov. 2—(UP)—Charles LeRoy Scott, 60, city fireman, was killed instantly on a farm near Lincolnville today when a revolver he was carrying since being deputized as a special policeman to aid in the search for Indiana's escaped convicts, fell from his holster and was discharged.

Three Bandits Rob Lansing, Mich., Bank

Lansing, Mich., Nov. 2—(UP)—Three armed bandits held up the North Lansing branch of the Lansing bank today and escaped with \$8,000 in cash.

State police and local officers immediately blocked all highways and side roads leading from the city.

Desperate Criminal Escapes From Trap

Chicago, Nov. 2—(UP)—Federal officers who broke up the Bailey-Kelly gang of kidnapers closed in today on Cerne C. Miller, last of the band that terrorized the midwest with criminal daring.

The former South Dakota Sheriff shot his way out of an elaborate trapset last night by Federal

agents. His automobile, blood stained, was found later. His wife was arrested in a hotel apartment they had occupied.

Miller was described by federal officers as the most desperate gunman outside of prison. He is credited with handling the machine gun in the Union Station massacre in which five men were killed in Kansas city last June 17.
