Also interest at the rate of 8% will be charged from the date of delinquency until paid. Those who have bought or sold property and wish a division of taxes are asked to come in at once. Call on the Auditor for errors and any reductions. The Treasurer can make no corrections.

The Treasurer will not be responsible for the payment of delinquent taxes resulting from the omission of the taxpayers to state definitely on what property, they desire to pay, in whose name it may be found, in what township or corporation it is situated.
