Although they established a virtual blockade around the town, cut off all telephone communication for most of the night and awakened the sleeping occupants of many homes for questioning, the militiamen insisted they had not declared martial law.

The main body of troopers was kept at a state police substation several miles away. The others drove into the main street in the lark night in nine automobiles, one for each of the alleged culprits.

Each car of officers had orders to apprehend one particular man. After banging on several doors, shouting to upstairs windows, and skidding their cars to halts before the hiding places of suspects, the whole town was aroused. Lights were switched on. Citizens with their nightshirts stuffed in their trousers hurried to the streets and soon Princess Anne looked as though it were holding a weird all night celebration.

Residents trailed the troopers when they could to watch the invasion of homes. One citizen reported that the soldiers knocked the door of Thompson's home off its hinges when he did not obey.

Today's meeting of the grand jury was the last active session of the present panel. Dougherty charged that Dr. Alice shot and chloroformed here titian haired young daughter-in-law to death and that Earle planned the crime, purchased cartridges, taught his mother to shoot his revolver and incited her to the deed.

Both suspects were held in county jail on warrants charging murder. Rheta's body was found on an operating table in the basement of the Wynekoop family's unmodeled mansion on the west side a week ago. As though for a medical examination, it had been stripped of clothing. A bullet wound in the back and presence

of chloroform in the body explained the death.

Subsequently Dr. Alice signed a statement admitting that she administered chloroform to the girl. When Rheta died from the chloroform the physician shot the dead body, the statement said. Dr. Alice first ascribed her daughter-in-law's death to a prowler's bullet.

This statement was repudiated yesterday for the physician by Frank Tyrrell, her attorney.

Earle, likewise, signed a confession to having a part in the killing. He admitted the shooting. Later he admitted his story was a hoax. Police proved to their own satisfaction that Earle was out of the city at the time of the killing.

Criticism of the administration leveled by former Governor Alfred E. Smith, Matthew Woll, vice-president of the American Federation of Labor, and Sprague was "for the purpose of perpetuating the seat, not of capitalism, but of Morganism," the priest charged.

In Switch of Cuban Envoys



Jefferson Caffery, named by President Roosevelt to succeed Sumner Welles as U. S. Ambassador to Cuba, is a veteran diplomat who has served his country in virtually every quarter of the globe. Beginning his diplomatic career in 1911 as secretary to the U. S. Legation at Caracas, Venezuela, he served in most European capitals as well as held many posts throughout South America. Caffery comes into the Cuban post as the result of requests to President Roosevelt that Ambassador Welles be recalled. Regarded as a national hero after the fall of the Machado regime, Welles is said to have clashed repeatedly with the administration of President Grau San Martin who succeeded Carlos De Cespedes as ruler of Cuba.

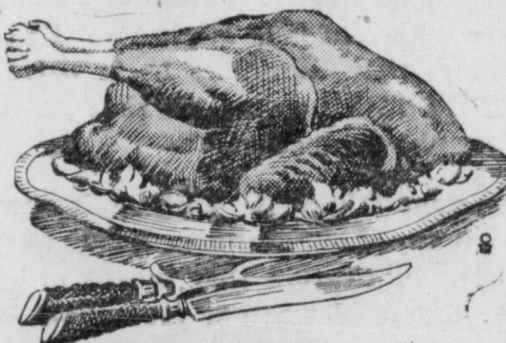
