## CLAIMS MONEY USED IN ESCAPE

### Gov. McNutt Answers Charges Concerning State Prison Escape

Kokomo, Ind., Mar. 21.—(U.P.)—In fighting mood, Gov. Paul V. McNutt last night promised to prove that the escape of 10 convicts from the state prison last September was made possible through payment of money.

His promise was made while addressing a Democratic rally here and after he had accepted a challenge of Republicans to make the escape of John Dillinger from Lake county a campaign issue.

"Some day I'll be able to announce to the people of Indiana exactly what happened in connection with the escape of the prison convicts," he said.

"One day I will have enough proof as to who paid the money and who got it."

"I can say that not a man whom the prisoners went through was an appointee of this administration. I made a mistake at Michigan City by not cleaning house enough."

McNutt said that because the Republicans could not find anything wrong with his administration they were seizing upon the sensational escape of Dillinger as a campaign issue.

"I hope they do," he added. "They can't find anything else wrong so they are resorting to slander."

"Dillinger was tried before a Re-state prison a year ago by Governor McNutt on recommendation of the state clemency commission."

"Dillinger was tried before a Republican judge in Morgan county," the governor explained.

"The judge and prosecutor told him if he would tell certain things they would let him off with a light sentence. Instead they gave him a 10-to-20-year sentence while they gave his partner, a former criminal, two to 14 years."

"This made a criminal of Dillinger."

The governor said that Dillinger's parole was recommended by the man he attempted to rob and by 169 residents of Mooresville.

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## JAPAN SEEKING LAW REVISION

### Report Says Japan Is Seeking Revision of Immigration Laws

(Copyright 1934 by United Press)

London, Mar. 21.—(U.P.)—Japan is seeking revision of American immigration laws, abandonment of Philippine naval and air bases and recognition of Manchukuo in return for an offer to maintain present naval ratios, it was said

in a most reliable source today. It was said that basis for negotiations would be established in correspondence between Secretary of State Cordell Hull and Koki Hirota, Japanese foreign minister.

Negotiations proper, it was added, would be conducted with Hull by Hiroshi Saito, now Japanese ambassador to the United States.

In sum, the informant said, the negotiations comprised an ambitious scheme to stabilize and improve relations between the United States and Japan.

It was said that Japan sought: 1—Revision of the clause of the 1924 immigration law under which Japanese immigration is forbidden.

2—United States' recognition of Manchukuo, the Japanese foster-

ed state formed out of Chinese Manchuria, of which Pu Yi, head of the Manchukuo house, has been made emperor.

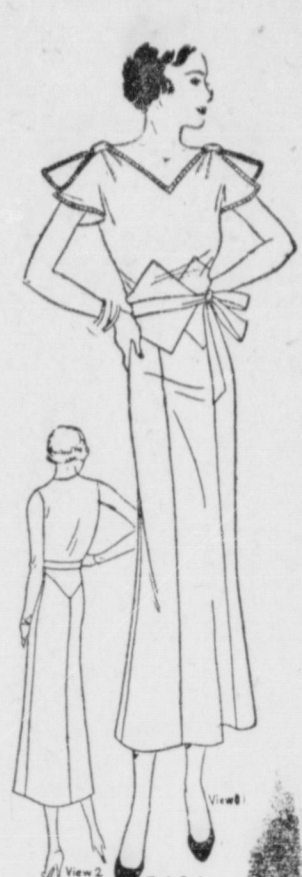
3—Abandonment of United States naval and air bases in the Philippines at an early date.

As regards the proposal for abandonment of the naval and air bases, it was said, Japan was believed to be willing to join in a pledge to guarantee the Philippines' neutrality.

Japan, it was said, was believed to be prepared to renounce its recent insistence on naval parity with the United States and Great Britain at the projected 1935 naval conference.
