EMPLOYERS TO  
OBTAIN COPIESMust Submit Applications  
For NRA Provisions  
By Saturday

Saturday, April 14, is the day on  
which all employers will be ex-  
pected to have submitted their ap-  
plications to the NRA for copies  
of the labor provisions of their  
codes. It is announced today by  
Fred Hoke, state NRA compliance  
director.

A recent regulation of the National  
Recovery Administration re-  
quires that every employer post in  
a conspicuous place in their estab-  
lishment a copy of the wage and  
hour provisions of the code to  
which they are subject. The order  
of General Johnson dated February  
28 provided that within 45 days  
from that date, or 45 days from the  
date of approval of a code, which-  
ever is the later, each employer  
must make application for official  
copies of the labor provisions of  
each code to which he is subject.  
This means that for those codes  
approved prior to February 28, the  
deadline for making application is  
April 14.

The distribution of the application  
forms is being handled largely  
by the national code authorities.  
However, the state compliance di-  
rector is enlisting the cooperation  
of the local compliance boards and  
code authorities as well as the state  
code authorities in obtaining full  
coverage of the various industries.
