EMPLOYERS TO OBTAIN COPIES

Must Submit Applications For NRA Provisions By Saturday

Saturday, April 14, is the day on which all employers will be expected to have submitted their applications to the NRA for copies of the labor provisions of their codes. It is announced today by Fred Hoke, state NRA compliance director.

A recent regulation of the National Recovery Administration requires that every employer post in a conspicuous place in their establishment a copy of the wage and hour provisions of the code to which they are subject. The order of General Johnson dated February 23 provided that within 45 days from that date, or 45 days from the date of approval of a code, whichever is the later, each employer must make application for official copies of the labor provisions of each code to which he is subject. This means that for those codes approved prior to February 28, the deadline for making application is April 14.

The distribution of the application forms is being handled largely by the national code authorities. However, the state compliance director is enlisting the cooperation of the local compliance boards and code authorities as well as the state code authorities in obtaining full coverage of the various industries.

A supply of the application forms for copies of the code labor provisions is on file in the Chamber of Commerce and may be returned without postage. These cards should be filled out and returned to the appropriate national code authority or where the employer does not know the address of the code authority, to the National Recovery Administration in Washington.

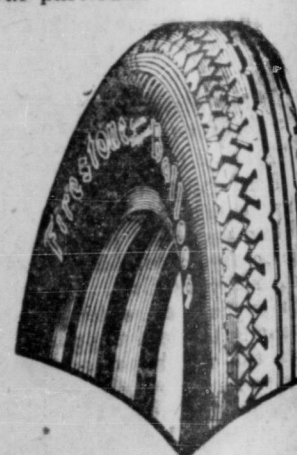
