**NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS**

Notice is hereby given that Mon-  
day, May 1, will be the last day  
to pay your Spring installment of  
taxes. The county treasurer's office  
will be open from 8 A. M. to 4 P. M.  
during the tax paying season. All  
taxes not paid by that time will be  
considered delinquent and will be  
subject to added plus interest at the  
rate of 8% from date of delinquency.

Those who have bought or sold prop-  
erty and wish a division of taxes  
are advised to come in at once.

Call on the Auditor for errors and  
any reductions. The Treasurer can  
make no corrections.

The Treasurer will not be responsi-  
ble for the penalty of delinquent  
taxes resulting from the omission  
of the name of the town in which  
what property, the desire to pay  
in whose name it may be found  
in what township or corporation it  
is situated.

Persons owing delinquent taxes  
should pay them at once, the law is  
such that there is no option left for  
the Treasurer but to enforce the col-  
lection of delinquent taxes.

County orders will not be paid to  
anyone owing delinquent taxes. All  
persons are warned against this.

Particular attention! If you pay  
taxes in more than one township  
mention the fact to the Treasurer  
also see that your receipts call for  
all your real estate and personal  
property.

For making inquiries of the Treas-  
urer regarding taxes to insure re-  
ceipt do not fail to include return pos-  
tage.

law's gang escaped an ambush  
Monday night, citizens signed a  
petition condemning the federal  
agents' "irresponsible conduct" in  
letting Dillinger slip through their  
fingers.

**Hold Conference**

Indianapolis, April 26 (UPI)  
The hunt for John Dillinger and  
recent charges of non-cooperation  
among state and federal law  
enforcement officers were discussed

here today by Al G. Feeney, state  
safety director, and E. J. Connel-  
ly, special agent of the federal  
department of justice.

Feeney said the conference did  
not divulge any new clues as to  
the desperado's whereabouts and  
denied he had criticized any law  
enforcement officers for failure to  
cooperate in the hunt.

The state police head pointed  
out that his department had fur-  
nished information to Chicago  
police when various raids on gang  
hideouts were made there last  
winter and said federal agents  
had been given all data gathered

by Indiana authorities.  
Feeney said he favored close  
contact among all law enforce-  
ment officers on any case.

Two university students who were  
arrested last night, were released
