Floyd Hunter, manager of the team, also announced today that boys unable to make the first team, will be handled by Bob Cole, who organizes teams and play a regular schedule.

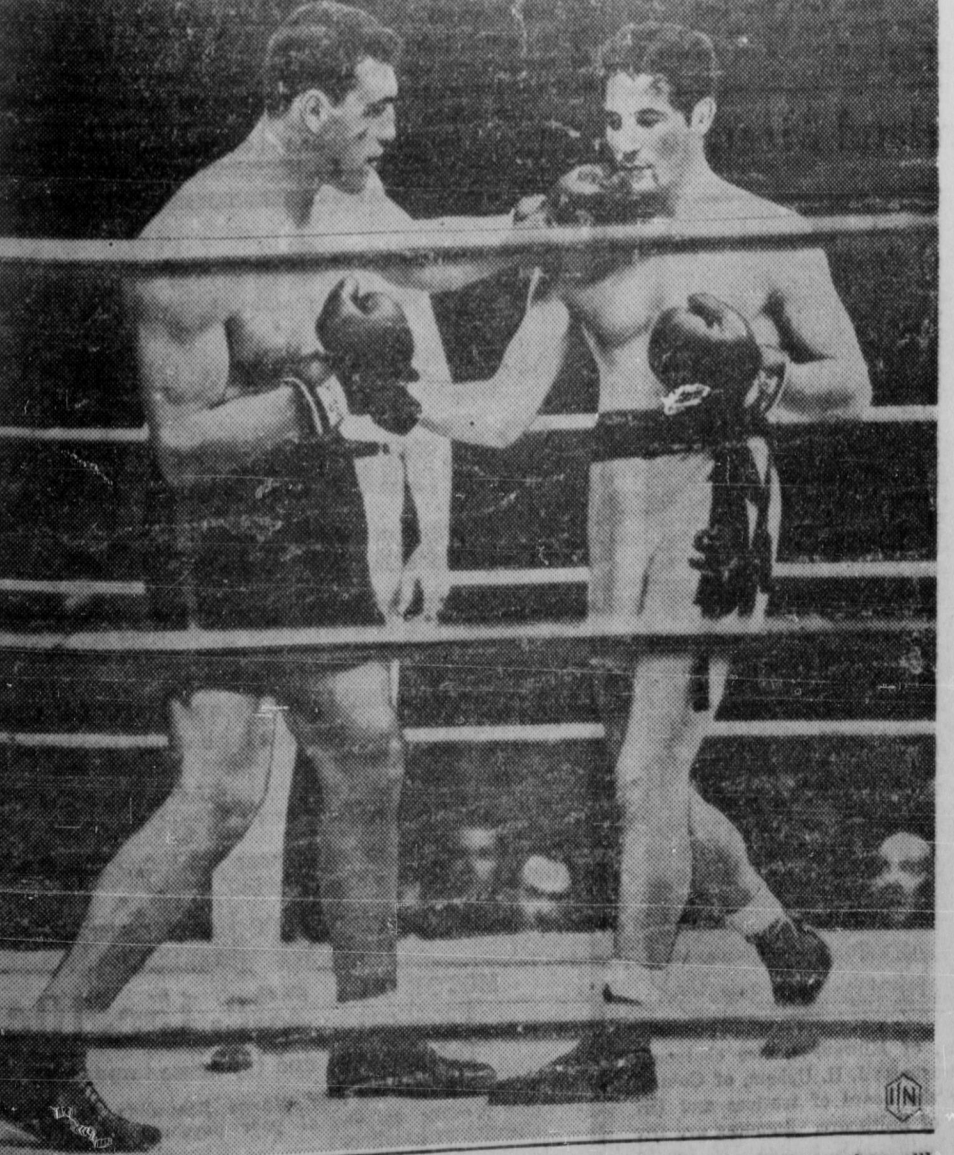

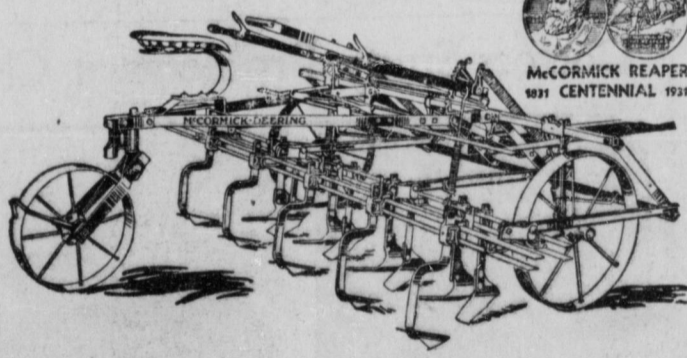
