will be.


Occasionally we hear some one

To Soften Brown Sugar

Brown sugar can be softened and
made easier to measure by placing
it in a flat baking pan and placing
in the oven for a few minutes. How-
ever, it should be watched closely
to prevent burning.

Plan to Immunize Dogs

Wheeling, W. Va.—(U.P.)—A plan
for immunizing all dogs in West
Virginia against rabies as a public
health measure, was outlined by
Dr. A. E. McClue, state health com-
missioner, at closing session
of the state public health council.
McClue opened the way for sta-
tization of the mentally un-
stable institutions by approving
state law, passed in 1923, but not
used.
