COUNTY AGENT'S COLUMN

The Hoosier Gold Medal Colt club is starting its tenth year with 1268 foals belonging to 928 different owners in 45 counties, a 57 per cent increase over last year. To old and new members alike, we extend greetings and best wishes for success this coming year.

The best single grain for growing colts is oats, but this year many have no oats and can't get any. However, if corn is fed without proper precaution, colts may develop puffy hocks and stocked legs. Our greatest problem for this year is how to feed corn with other feeds to get best results.

Here are three grain mixtures that have been tested by corn belt experiment stations and are recommended for developing colts where oats are scarce or unavailable. Feed 1 to 1.25 pounds daily for each cwt. of colt.

Whole Oats	50%	

No. 2		
Shelled corn	70%	
Wheat bran	25%	
Linseed oilmeal	5%	

No. 3		
Shelled corn	40%

With the above mixtures feed a legume hay and a non-leguminous roughage; the legume part may be clover, alfalfa or soybean hay
